
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

2.1 SAFETY DEFINITIONS

 the product. Greenworks is not responsible for any injuries, damages or legal disputes caused by a rider's
 inexperience or failure to follow the instructions in this manual.
- For your safety, DO NOT modify the product or change parts without professional assistance. Use only
 Greenworks approved parts and accessories. Modifications to the product could interfere with its operations,
 result in serious injury and/or void the Limited Warranty.
- · If the product makes an abnormal sound or displays an error code, stop riding immediately.
- Do not allow anyone to ride the product on their own unless they have carefully read this manual. Assist new
 riders until they are comfortable with the basic operation of this product.
- Do not exceed the total weight limit of 220 lbs (100 kg) including backpacks and other items that might be carried. Exceeding the weight limit could injure the rider and/or damage the product.

Riding Surfaces and Environment:

- 2. Anyone with a condition that advises against engaging in strenuous physical activity.
- 3. Anyone whose age and weight is outside the stated limits (See Technical data).
- 4. Anyone who is extremely fatigued, or has balancing issues.
- 5. Anyone with any health or physical disabilities and/or impairments, limitation, and conditions which could limit them from proper operation.

Preparations before Riding:

- Ensure proper assembly before each use.
- Make sure that you correctly assemble the product before its use. If parts of the product are damaged or missing, do not use the product. Contact the service center.
- · Check to confirm that covers and guards are in place and in serviceable condition.
- Make sure there are no loose fasteners and damaged parts.
- · Check the status of the power supply circuit, lighting, LED display, etc. and make sure they are working normally.

- The brake should function properly and the brake cables should be in good condition.
- Make sure the handlebars are stable, and that the front and rear wheels are not shaky or loose.
- Make sure the reflectors are not damaged or dirty.
- Make sure to wear a helmet and other protective gear.
- Do not carry heavy cargo.
- When the battery is low (the LED display shows less than two bars), please use the original charger to charge
 immediately. Replace the battery if it is damaged.
- Ensure normal tire pressure. Improper tire pressure or overloading can cause loss of control. Loss of control can
 result in severe injury or death. Make sure the tire tread is intact.

Instructions on Riding and Usage:

- If any abnormality occurs, stop riding immediately and promptly contact the after-sales service hotline. Do not ride
 until any damage or corrective actions and/or maintenance issues have been corrected.
- · Do not accelerate or brake abruptly when riding except in an emergency.
- Hold the handlebars firmly with both hands to avoid serious injuries from loss of balance or falling. Do not touch
 the brake or electric motor on your product when in use or immediately after riding, as these parts can become
 very hot.
- · Stay alert and ride cautiously. Always keep a safe distance between you and other vehicles.
- Do not use a cell phone, camera, headphones, earbuds or engage in any other activities which distract you while riding.
- Slow down when approaching intersections, motorways, corners, doors, etc. Yield for pedestrians, bicycles and
 motor vehicles. The product can operate more quietly than other motorized products. Exercise caution when in



3.1 INSTALL THE HANDLEBARS AND DISPLAY PANEL


A WARNING

Failure to properly adjust and tighten the screws that affix the handlebars and display panel can cause rider to lose control and crash.


1. Unscrew and remove the front clamp from the display panel.



 Position the handlebars on the brackets, attach the upper clamps to the handlebars, and securely tighten the screws.




Mount the display panel to its original position, reattach the front clamp, and securely tighten the screws.



WARNING

To prevent loss of control or severe injury, securely tighten the screws to ensure that the handlebars and display panel are stable and do not move forward or backward.



3.2 INFLATE THE TIRES

Tires are inflated when shipped, but they invariably lose pressure during transit. Inflate the tires to the correct PSI (10 PSI (69 kPa) to 24 PSI (165 kPa)) before first time use. Failure to do so may damage your product and void your warranty.


Lower air pressure can result in a shorter ride time. Periodically check front tire. Reinflate when needed.

WARNING

Do not overinflate, as this could damage the tire or wheel.

Note: The pressurized air supplies found at gasoline stations are designed to inflate high-volume automobile tires. If you decide to use such an air supply to inflate your tires, first make sure the pressure gauge is working, then use very short bursts to inflate to the correct PSI. If you inadvertently overinflate the tire, release the excess pressure immediately.

1. Using a bicycle style pump equipped for a Schradertype valve, inflate both tires to the correct PSI.



4 OPERATION

This section describes how to operate the product.

A WARNING

Carefully read and understand the safety chapter and operation instructions before you operate the product.

4.1 BEFORE YOU RIDE

4.1.1 PRE-RIDE SAFETY CHECKLIST

1. Brake

Check the brake for proper function. When you squeeze the lever, the brake should provide positive braking action.

2. Tires

Periodically inspect the tires for excess wear and replace as needed. Regularly check the tire pressure and inflate as needed.

3. Frame and Handlebars

Check for cracks or broken connections. Although broken frames are rare, it is possible for an aggressive rider to run into a curb or object and wreck, bend, or break the frame. Get in the habit of inspecting your product on a regular basis. Avoid impacting into any solid objects, or wrecking. Always conduct a 360° safety check/inspection of your product for any damages, cracks, bent, or broken parts.

4. Hardware/Loose Parts

Before every ride, check all parts, such as nuts, bolts, cables, fasteners, etc., to ensure they are secure and assembled correctly. There should not be any unusual rattles or sounds from loose parts or broken components. If the product is damaged, do not ride. Refer to "Important safety instructions" on this manual.

5. Personal protective equipment

Always wear proper protective gear when riding product, such as an approved safety helmet. Elbow pads, kneepads, pants, and long sleeves are recommended. Always wear closed toe shoes (laceup with rubber soles) and keep shoelaces tied and out of the way of the wheels, motor and drive system. NEVER RIDE BAREFOOTED OR IN SANDALS.

6. Laws and Regulations

Always check and obey any local laws or regulations.

7. Insurance

Do not assume that your existing insurance policies necessarily provide coverage for electric product use. Check with your insurance company for information regarding insurance.


4.1.5 CONNECT THE BATTERIES TO THE PRODUCT

WARNING


Only use Greenworks original batteries with the product.

Tip: Install two batteries simultaneously to achieve peak performance.

- 1. Make sure that the batteries are fully charged.
- 2. Lift the release latch to open the battery lid.



 Push the batteries into the battery compartment. The battery locks into position when you hear a click.




Note: If the battery does not fit easily into the battery holder, it may not be installed correctly, which can cause damage to the battery and/or the product.


- 4. Make sure that the batteries are installed correctly.
- 5. Close and lock the battery lid.

4.2 START THE PRODUCT


1. Grab both handles, sit down on the saddle, flip the kickstand up, center the bike with both feet.



2. Push the power button to turn on the product.




3. Squeeze the brake lever to activate the product.




Note: After the product completely stops for 1 minute, it will lock automatically. Squeeze the brake lever to unlock the product.

4. Press the direction control switch to choose your desired riding direction.



Switch Position	Riding Direction
D (Drive)	Forward
N (Neutral)	Park
R (Reverse)	Reverse

5. Check for the appropriate speed mode by pressing riding speed switch to "E" position.




Switch Position	Riding Speed
E (ECO)	Slow
S (Sport)	Fast

Note: It is always recommended to start out in low speed mode.

6. Place both hands on the handlebars. Gently turn the throttle inward to start your trip.




7. Keep both feet on the footrests when the product is in motion.



4.3 ADJUST THE HEADLIGHT

Press the light switch to adjust the headlight.

4.4 RIDE UPHILL/DOWNHILL

▲ WARNING

The maximum slope should not exceed 15°.

Uphill

- 1. Stop and evaluate the terrain before attempting to ride. Use extreme caution when riding uphill.
- 2. While riding uphill, slowly increase the throttle to maintain your momentum to reach the top.
- Always ride through to the top of the hill, slow down when you approach the top of the hill. Slowing down before you reach the top could lead to rolling backwards, which could result in personal injury.

If it is determined that the product will not make it to the top of the slope:

- Do not try to turn the product around while riding, this could cause the product to roll over.
- Slowly back the product down the slope while applying the brakes.

▲ WARNING

Do not ride the product downhill on a sharp angle, this could cause the product to flip over.

Downhill

- Stop and evaluate the terrain before attempting to ride. Make sure the slope is not too steep, the terrain is not loose or slippery and there are no obstacles.
- 2. While going downhill, gently tap/apply the brakes as needed. Depressing the brakes too fast or hard could result in a crash.

4.5 SPEAKER FUNCTION

With this product, you can enjoy music through your Bluetooth-enabled phone.

- 1. Turn on the product.
- 2. Turn on the Bluetooth function on your phone.
- 3. Choose device GW-60MBL520-***** to pair.
- 4. Use your phone to control the volume.

4.6 STOP THE PRODUCT

1. Gradually release the throttle and firmly squeeze the front and rear brake levers to stop the product.

Note: When coming to a complete stop, place both feet on the ground to balance the product.

- 2. Press the direction control switch to "N" position.
- 3. Push the power button to turn off the product.
- 4. Push the battery release button and pull out the battery.

5 SMARTG HOME APPLICATION


SMARTg Home is a free mobile application that provides additional features for your Greenworks product. These features include extended information about products, product parts and servicing.

5.1 SETUP

Note: Always set up first before riding.

- 1. Download the SMARTg Home app on your mobile device.
- 2. Register in the SMARTg Home app.
- 3. Follow the instructions in the SMARTg Home app to connect and register the product.

Note: Ensure that your phone's Bluetooth function is always on.



6 MAINTENANCE

i IMPORTANT

6.1 CLEAN THE PRODUCT

CAUTION

- Keep water away from battery compartment while washing to avoid damaging the electrical components.
- DO NOT clean with alcohol, gasoline, acetone, or other corrosive/volatile solvents. These substances may
 damage the external and internal structure of your product.
- · DO NOT rub with sandpaper or metal brush.

Clean the product after each use with water, neutral detergent, and a soft cloth.

6.2 CLEAN THE BATTERY AND BATTERY CHARGER

WARNING

DO NOT clean the battery or the battery charger with water.

- Make sure that the battery and the battery charger are clean and dry before you insert the battery into the battery charger.
- Clean the battery terminals with a soft and dry cloth.
- Clean the surface of the battery and the battery charger with a soft and dry cloth.

6.3 EXAMINE THE BATTERY AND THE BATTERY CHARGER

Carefully inspect the battery, battery charger, and connection cord of the battery charger for any signs of damage, such as cracks or broken parts. Replace if necessary.

7 TRANSPORTATION, STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

7.1 TRANSPORTATION

- Any removable (electronic) parts, such as the charger and battery, should always be removed from the product before transport.
- · Avoid transporting the product in bad weather conditions when possible.

- 5. Store the product in a safe place and ensure that unauthorized persons, including children, do not touch the product.
